Collocations consist of two or more words that frequently appear together, creating natural-sounding expressions in a language. For instance, the word **strong** collocates with **wind**. Thus, we say **strong wind** rather than **hard wind**.

Types of collocation	Examples
Adjective + noun	She has a strong accent .
Adverb + adjective	She is incredibly smart .
Adverb + verb	He deeply regretted his words.
Noun + preposition	She has a talent for singing.
Verb + noun	They made a decision to move abroad.
Noun + verb	The wind howls through the trees last night.
Noun + noun	The police arrested a sex offender yesterday.
