

The future continuous tense

| Use | Example sentence |
|--|--|
| Action in progress at a specific future moment | At 9 p.m. tomorrow, I will be watching TV. |
| Predicted and continuous actions | By next year, she will be studying abroad. |
| Simultaneous events in the future | I'll be cooking dinner while he will be cleaning the house. |
| Habitual events in the future | Starting next week, we will be meeting every Friday. |

Structures

| Form | Structure | Example sentence |
|-------------|-------------------------------------|---|
| Affirmative | Subject + will be + verb (-ing) | <ul style="list-style-type: none">She will be working tomorrow morning.They will be playing football at noon tomorrow. |
| Negative | Subject + will not be + verb (-ing) | <ul style="list-style-type: none">They will not be coming tonight.She will not be staying at the hotel tonight. |
| Question | Will + subject + be + verb (-ing)? | <ul style="list-style-type: none">Will you be joining us later?Will they be visiting us next summer? |
