Usage	We use the present simple tense to talk about habits, routines, general truths, and facts that are always or regularly true.		
Positive	Subject + base verb <b>(+ s/es)</b>	<ul> <li>He plays football every weekend.</li> <li>I play football every weekend.</li> <li>I washes my hair regularly.</li> <li>She studies Anthropology at the University of Cambridge.</li> <li>He goes to school by bus.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Add -s to most verbs with he/she/it.</li> <li>Add -es to verbs ending in -ch, -sh, -ss, -x, -o → watches, washes, passes, fixes, goes.</li> <li>Change -y to -ies if the verb ends in a consonant + y → study → studies.</li> </ul>
Negative	Subject + do/does + <b>not</b> + base verb	She does not like vegetables.	No -s/-es on the verb! Use do/ does + base verb.
Question	Do/Does + subject + base verb?	<ul><li>Do you like vegetables?</li><li>Does she like vegetables?</li></ul>	No -s/-es on the verb! Use do/ does + base verb.
